WORKSHOPS AT OSTEOLOGY MONACO

## **LEARN FROM WORLD-CLASS SPECIALISTS IN ORAL REGENERATION**

**The International Osteology Symposia are well known for their intensive practical and theoretical training in workshops, which have become a hallmark of the Foundation. 20 workshops and 3 Master Clinician Courses will be inviting attendees to learn regenerative therapies from world-class specialists and gain their own experience at the International Osteology Symposium in Monaco in April 2016.**

Regenerative therapies require a high degree of dexterity – from the first incision to the last suture. Anyone wanting to remain up to date is dependent on regular practice and trial, because the repertoire of therapies is constantly being supplemented by new techniques and materials.

The pre-symposium day of the International Osteology Symposium with 20 practical and theoretical workshops will take place on 21 April 2016. In addition, three Master Clinician Courses will be organised for the first time.

### **A whole day dedicated to learning from the experts**

“Learning the WHY and the HOW in regenerative therapy” is the symposium's main theme. Top speakers from all over the world will spend two days presenting and discuss the current state of knowledge and the open questions in regenerative therapies. However, the day prior to the congress is dedicated solely to training and learning. The Osteology Foundation itself is organizing five practical and three theoretical workshops as well as the three Master Clinician Courses. Then there are twelve practical and theoretical workshops organized by Founding and Gold Partners.

### **"Hands-on" is the motto for the practical workshops**

Procedures for both bone and soft tissue regeneration are at the core of the practical exercises. Using different models, such as pig jaws, attendees can learn flap formation, incision types and suture techniques, practice widening up of keratinised mucosa, perform vertical and horizontal

bone augmentation using different techniques, practice ridge preservation combined with socket seal or try out the management of bone defects at implant sites. The clear objective of the workshops is to teach attendees current therapy concepts and provide practical tips for everyday dental practice.

### **Workshops for researchers**

The Osteology Foundation is also proud to hold workshops for researchers. Two theoretical workshops will deal with methodological aspects and research design in clinical research, and a third one will focus on cell biology and histology in biomaterial research.

### **For the first time: Master Clinician Courses**

The Master Clinician Courses, which are included in the registration fee, are a new concept and will be organized for the first time at Osteology Monaco 2016. In these theoretical courses, renowned experts will present techniques and procedures on the following topics:

- Flaps and grafts in gingival recession
- Implant placement post extraction – how to proceed?
- How to deal with hard and soft tissue defects in the aesthetic zone.
